Seniors and snow

- Seniors cited snowy sidewalks as a leading cause for fear of falling in MA DPH statewide focus groups
- 2000 21% of Massachusetts
- population older than 55 2030 33% of Massachusetts population older than 55
- Serious health impacts to seniors if
- More than one in five Americans age 65 and older do not drive
