# Quick Facts about the Certified in Public Health (CPH) Process

## What is CPH?

The CPH is a voluntary credential that demonstrates your mastery of the knowledge and skills relevant to contemporary public health. It's akin to the national standard that every other health profession has.

## Who is eligible to become CPH?

Student/alumni candidates must either have or be earning a graduate degree from a school or program of public health accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health. Professional candidates must have taken the core public health courses at a CEPH accredited institution in addition to meeting minimum experiential or other academic requirements. ## What are benefits of CPH?

- Assure the community that you serve that you met and maintain a professional standard.
- Increase recognition of the public health professions .
- Measures and improves the competency and consistency of public health workers everywhere.
- Stay current on best practices and education through the free, online CPH Recertification & Reporting System.
- Students at some institutions may substitute the CPH for a local comprehensive exam and earn the CPH at graduation.

## Where and when is the CPH exam offered?

- AMP Assessment Sites across the U.S. and around the world
- Twice per year, in February and October
- Registrants choose their preferred test date and site after completing registration online
- Deferrals are allowed until the next exam cycle

## How much does the CPH exam cost?

Regular prices start at \$385 for students and \$395 for alumni. Some schools and program offer special discounts for their alumni and students.

## How do I maintain the CPH?

50 hours of CE every 2 years

- Retakes are allowed at the going rate for the next exam cycle.
