What is Photovoice?

Photovoice lets us share Latina intimate partner violence (IPV) survivors' journeys to a life free from abuse. Their unique experiences will help increase awareness of domestic abuse and available resources for Latinas.

What challenges do Latina IPV survivors experience?

- Embarrassment, shame, guilt
- Communication barriers
- Cultural and familial pressures
- Financial dependence
- Lack of knowledge of available resources

Where and how do Latinas seek support?

- Family and friends
- Religion and faith
- Social services
- Education
