- Need to align health homes with upstream assessment tools for community planning and policy development.

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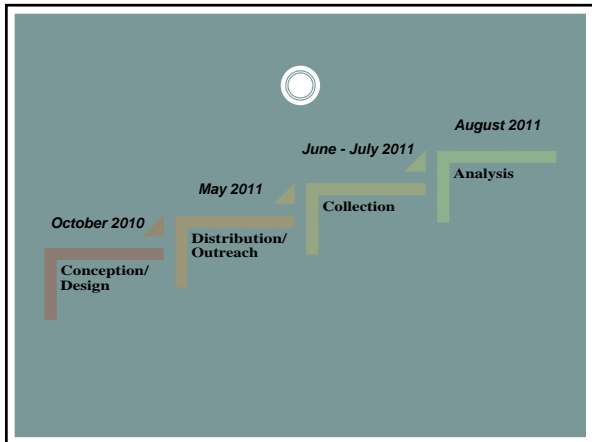
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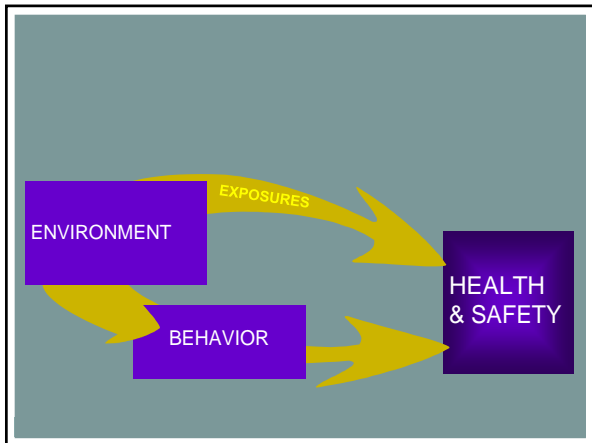
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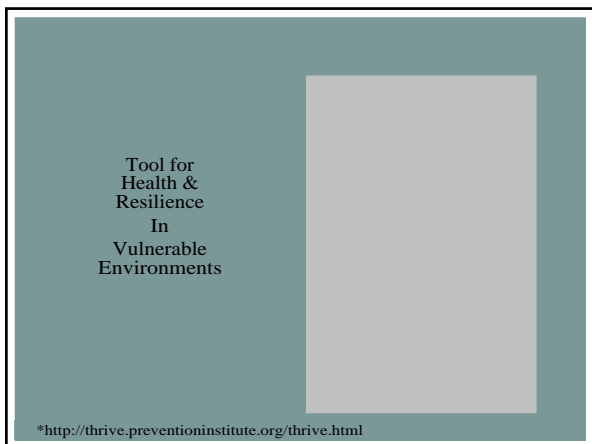

Improve HS track and field access (lights, consistent times to enter, etc.)	City, Mayor, City Council

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Priority 2: Jobs	
Shop Local campaign	Newspaper, Chamber of Commerce
Assess business gaps and recruit needed businesses	County Commissioners
Incentives for new businesses	City and County Governments, Stronger Economies Together
Promote local businesses	Chamber of Commerce

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Priority 3: Housing	
Incentives for housing contractors, including access to state code enforcers	City and County Governments
Ensure infrastructure (water, electric, sewer, etc.) to encourage contractors	City and County Governments
Join Southwest Housing Corporation	Elizabeth Burr to check to see if Hidalgo Co. is current member
Recruit developers to the county	City and County Governments

- Search for funding opportunities

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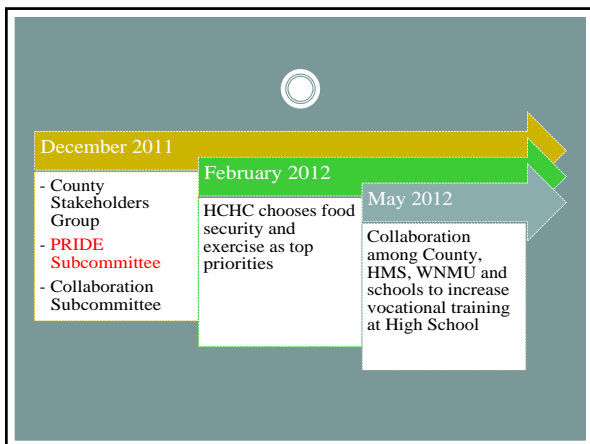
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- Shaping the tool to community context
