

- Includes 5 Indian reservations































#### Return on Investment



Results from Manistee Manor, 75 units, HUD

- Costs 9 times more to turn a smoker's apartment
- Average 12 turnovers per year, 2-3 were smokers
- 8% of maintenance cost per year
- Their wait list went up 25%
- Reduce the risk of fire

# Market Demands: 2012 Survey Results



7 out of 10 renters would choose smokefree housing



2 out of 5 renters would pay *more* for a smoke-free amenity



1 out of 5 renters who smoke would choose smoke-free housing




