What is this "transition to ICD-10-CM"?

- Transition from ICD-9-CM to ICD-10-CM to code health information in administrative datasets
- ICD-10-CM is more complex than ICD-9-CM
 - Injury diagnosis codes
 - 2,600 in ICD-9-CM; 43,000 in ICD-10-CM
 - External cause codes
 - 1,300 in ICD-9-CM; 7,500 in ICD-10-CM
- Standard case definitions, reporting frameworks, analytic software programs, etc. need to be updated for ICD-10-CM

General Equivalence Mappings (GEMs)

- A code to code reference dictionary for ICD-9-CM and ICD-10-CM
- Offers possible acceptable translation alternatives
- One ICD-9-CM code can be represented by multiple ICD-10-CM codes and vice versa
- Some codes in ICD-10-CM do not have a comparable code in ICD-9-CM



Injury Diagnosis Framework



- Will be published as a National Health Statistics Report by the CDC/National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS)
- Available on the web by end of year

Proposed Surveillance Case Definitions

Traumatic Brain Injury

- Collaborative effort between NCHS/NCIPC, completed in 2014
- Applied GEMS to current ICD-9-CM case definition
 800.0-801.9, 803.0-804.9, 850.0-854.1, 950.1-950.3, 995.55, 959.01
- Input solicited from other federal agencies
- Input from injury research, surveillance and prevention partners

PROPOSED ICD-10-CM Surveillance Definition for Traumatic Brain Injury

S02.8, S02.91	Fracture of other specified skull and facial bones; Unspecified fracture of skull

S07.1	Crushing injury of skull	
T74.4	Shaken infant syndrome

Consensus Methods for Initial Testing and Validation of the ICD-10-CM Injury Diagnosis and External Cause Frameworks

Safe States Injury Surveillance Workgroup 9 (ISW9)

- Participants from CDC, CSTE, SAVIR, State Health Departments
- To assist states in the transition to ICD-10-CM
- To develop analysis methods and data presentation tables for use in testing the ICD-10-CM injury frameworks

CDC Surveillance Quality Improvement (SQI) Year 5 project

- CDC funding to four states (CO, MA, NC, UT)
- Medical record review
- Proposal to dual code injury records in both ICD-9-CM and ICD-10-CM to assess comparability
 - Injury diagnosis
 - External cause
 - Activity

ICD-10-CM and Injury Severity Measures

- NHTSA Request for Information in 2014 to identify interest/need for software to map ICD-10-CM to AIS05
- Work by Mark Zonfrillo and AAAM to map ICD-10-CM to AIS 3+ Severity Injury
 - Traffic Injury Prevention (2015) 16, S197-S200
- Work by Turner Osler and others to map ICD-10-CM to AIS05

Summary

- Intensive effort to prepare for the transition to ICD-10-CM for injury morbidity data
- Multiple tools and training materials are available
 - Subject to revision after testing and assessment using ICD-10-CM coded data
- More work is needed
 - Additional surveillance definitions, e.g., SCI
 - Definitions for injury indicators
 - Exploration of codes outside the injury chapters
